

Policy on Validation of Clinical Content

Accredited providers are responsible for ensuring that their education is fair and balanced and that any clinical content presented supports safe, effective patient care. American Academy of CME will adhere to the following content validation value statements.

- All recommendations for patient care in accredited continuing education must be based on current science, evidence, and clinical reasoning, while giving a fair and balanced view of diagnostic and therapeutic options.
- All scientific research referred to, reported, or used in accredited education in support or
 justification of a patient care recommendation must conform to the generally accepted
 standards of experimental design, data collection, analysis, and interpretation.
- Although accredited continuing education is an appropriate place to discuss, debate, and
 explore new and evolving topics, these areas need to be clearly identified as such within
 the program and individual presentations. It is the responsibility of accredited providers
 to facilitate engagement with these topics without advocating for, or promoting, practices
 that are not, or not yet, adequately based on current science, evidence, and clinical
 reasoning.
- Accredited continuing education activities should not advocate for unscientific approaches to diagnosis or therapy, or promote recommendations, treatment, or manners of practicing healthcare that are determined to have risks or dangers that outweigh the benefits or are known to be ineffective in the treatment of patients.
